

# KOBE COMMUNITY FORUM



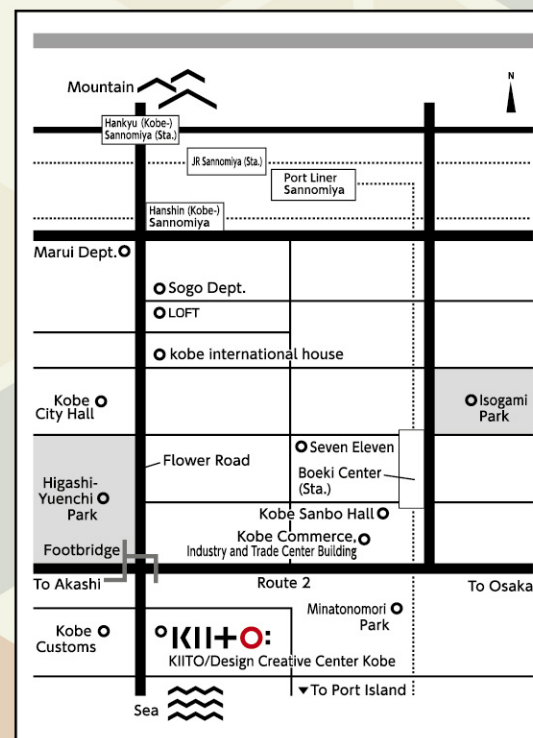
